
PROJECT OVERVIEW

2019	 Town meeting approved feasibility study (funded by State) for a New Senior Center Abacus Architects selected by PBC with COA input
2020	 COA documented current and future programming Visioning Meeting and visit to Medfield Senior Center Progress stalled by COVID
2021	 COA, Library, Recreation departments share input on needs and space PBC and COA working group established Abacus presents 3 options for a new center Cost estimates developed for each option
2022	 Four town-wide focus groups held to gather input on options Recommendation made to Select Board on which option to put forward for Town Meeting vote Warrant article approved for November 10th Town Meeting

THE NEED

- Today 30% of the population of Millis is over 60 years of age
- By the end of this decade, our Senior population is projected to grow to 50% of the total town population



- The current senior center opened in 1999 in the basement of the Veterans Memorial Building. The space is uninviting, inflexible, and inadequately sized for our Senior population:
 - Simultaneous programs cannot be held
 - There is no private space for our social worker to meet with clients
 - The reception area is in a hallway
 - The dining area accommodates only 24 people
 - There is a lack of storage
- The Senior Center offers necessary services, socialization opportunities, and well-being programs and needs the proper infrastructure to fulfill its mission
- What was appropriate 23 years ago is no longer suitable

THE OPTIONS

Option	Square footage	Total Cost	Cost to owner of Averaged Priced Home
Two story partial renovation and addition to the VMB	15,500	\$15.5M	\$258 per year
New construction at Cassidy Farm	16,000	\$16M	\$266 per year
New construction at Cassidy Farm with a gym	22,400	\$21M	\$350 per year

Assumptions:


- Finished product is built for a minimum 50 year life giving the town the best return for the investment
- Construction begins in Fall of 2023
- Bond at 4.25% over 30 years
- There will be additional operating costs for the site; decision have to be made on how those costs are covered

COMMUNITY INPUT

Four community meetings were held over May and June presenting the options and soliciting input. Each attendee was asked to identify what they saw as the pro's and con's of each option, and also asked to vote on their preferred option.

THE SELECTION



- 79% of the participants preferred one of the Cassidy Farm options
- A good deal of discussion on the cost of the projects from the participants
- Conclusion: put Cassidy Farm without the gym on the warrant for the November town meeting. It gets the location most participants preferred, acknowledges the cost issues raised, and the site has room for future expansion
